Travelers tend to use motorcycles for this journey as it is under 200km and is the easiest way to get around. Typically travelers take about a day to finish the **Samoeng Loop** and the Mae Sa Valley route.

Mae Sap Cave

Wat Phra That Doi Kham

The temple is more popularly known as Doi Suthep, which is also the name of the mountain that the temple is built on. In English, its name roughly translates to the Temple of the Golden Mountain.

The temple has a central stupa that is made of gold. The stupa has a large number of intricate carvings on it. The central stupa is surrounded by a couple of brown roofed structures which are meditation halls.

The temple is located less than 20km away from the city of Chiang Mai and as the name suggests is built atop the mountain. From the hilltop, there are many breathtaking views of downtown Chiang Mai.

While making a trip to the Wat Phra That Doi Kham make sure that you are modestly dressed and covered as this is a place of pilgrimage and is one of Thailand's most sacred sites for Buddhism.
